CALL TO ORDER/INVOCATION

Mr. Morris called the meeting to order, and Mr. McKlarney offered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. McCoy motioned to approve the November 20, 2025, minutes as presented. Mr. Baker seconded the motion. The motion was approved 5-0 as follows: Voting Yes: Mr. Baker, Mr. Lawson, Mr. Martin, Mr. McCoy and Mr. Morris

VDOT REPORT

Mr. David Clarke updated members on road maintenance within the county including a couple of winter storm clean ups, pipe work on Stateline Road, mowing, brush cutting on Cedar Drive, and dead deer pick up. He related the crew will be getting a new arm mower, which is being tested out.

Mr. Baker reported trees down on the guardrail on Route 61, a guardrail needed on Route 635 where the gas line was put in, and potholes on Kroft Road. Mr. McCoy stated Doe Creek looks good, and Kow Camp needs work. He related the pavement is being eaten out on Route 605, and there is no shoulder along the creek in that location. Mr. Lawson reported the creek is encroaching on Route 61 on the upper end and potholes on eastbound Route 460 between Narrows and Celanese.

Mr. Martin expressed concern about the intersection of Route 42 and Winding Way and asked if anything could be done to make it safer, noting line of sight issues. He inquired if a speed study had been conducted in that area. Mr. Clarke advised the speed limit is 35 through there, and he thinks all the legs have stop signs. Mr. Martin advised one has a yield. Mr. Clarke will have traffic engineering take a look at it. Mr. Martin reiterated the need for deceleration lanes at Cascade Drive and Doe Creek and asked that major points be pushed to obtain funding. He related Mr. Marty Farrier had requested a tractor sign on Clover Hollow, and a cycling sign would be good there as

well. Mr. Martin reported Rocky Sink is rough at the top, and there is a very deep ditch on Country Lane since the recent heavy rains. He requested an update on the sink hole. Mr. Clarke advised there might have been more movement, and it is a wait and see kind of situation. He reported there has been no indication of movement on the bridge. Mr. Morris related pavement is crumbling near the bridge from Sugar Run to Eaton's Chapel.

Mr. McCoy inquired about the shoulder on Route 460 near Howell Lane. Mr. Clarke believes it was fixed. Mr. McCoy reported the pavement is coming apart on Wilburn Valley Road up near Sugar Run. Mr. McKlarney inquired about progress on the replacement for the supervisor position. Mr. Clarke related interviews would take place the following week. Mr. Lawson reported the Town of Rich Creek had no issues with the abandonment of a portion of Route 1023.

OLD BUSINESS

VDOT ROAD ABANDONMENTS/DISCONTINUANCES

Mr. McKlarney presented resolutions from the previous meeting's public hearing regarding VDOT road abandonments. He recommended approval of the following: portions of Route 623 Rocky Hollow Road, Route 734 Parcell Lane and Route 785 Quail Road, segments of Route 750 Cedar Crest Loop and Route 730 Eggleston Road, and a portion of Route 1023 in Rich Creek. Mr. McKlarney suggested not approving Route 678 Bowens Road, adding he would like to talk to owners first regarding utility right of ways; and Route 748 off of Lurich Road, as it could prove a useful option if something happened on Route 460.

Mr. Baker motioned to approve the VDOT road abandonments/discontinuances as follows: Route 623 Rocky Hollow Road, Route 734 Parcell Lane, Route 785 Quail Road, segments of Route 750 Cedar Crest Loop and Route 730 Eggleston Road, and Route 1023 In Rich Creek. Mr. McCoy seconded the motion. The motion was approved 5-0 as follows: Voting Yes: Mr. Baker, Mr. Lawson, Mr. Martin, Mr. McCoy and Mr. Morris

NEW BUSINESS

RESOLUTION OF RECOGNITION – THACKER UNDERWOOD

Mr. McKlarney requested a resolution in recognition of Thacker Underwood, a local Eagle Scout, which is the highest level of attainment in the scouts. He noted Mr. Underwood had built kayak lockers at Camp Success in Narrows for one of his Eagle Scout projects and outlined other projects and services Mr. Underwood provided to the community.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

Dr. Marlin Campbell related the School Board would also be approving a resolution for the GHS volleyball team at its next meeting, and the GHS theater team will be traveling to compete at the state level during the weekend. He outlined the three main goals of the schools, noting academic achievement, graduation rates and absenteeism rates.
